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Following elements must be included:

Title page of manuscript: Title, Authors, names and initials, Address (and footnote with address for correspondence, if different)

Abstract in English and German

Introduction

Materials and methods

Results

Discussion and Conclusions

Acknowledgements

References

2) Your findings of statements should be outlined in the Introduction. Sufficient details of methods and equipment should be provided so that another worker can repeat your work, but minute details that are generally known should be omitted.

3) The position of tables and illustrations should be indicated in the margin of the manuscript. All pages should be numbered consecutively. The title page should include a concise, informative title, the names of all authors, and the name of the institution where the work was done. Plates will be added at the end of the paper. The display area is 166 x 240 mm.

4) The Abstract should cover the main points of the article and contain a statement of the problem, methodes, results and conclusion. If a german version is not possible the editor will translate the abstract.

5) The text of the paper should be divided into Introduction, Materials and Methodes, Results, Discussion and Conclusion. Figures, tables and figure captions should be submitted on separate sheets. Footnotes should be avoided whenever possible.

6) References should be listed alphabetically at the end of the paper and styled as in the following examples:

Journal papers: Names and initials of all authors, year, full title, journal abbreviated in accordance with international practice, volume number, first and last page numbers.
