- 560. [•]αβανοβανδαγο m.: B BD1, ah6. P [...]aban-bandag, named in a list. D "Slave of ...". It seems that the first component cannot be merely $\alpha\beta\alpha\nu$ (MP $\bar{A}b\bar{a}n$ "the Waters", attested in Bactrian as a month-name, BD2, 181a), as these letters are preceded by at least one more letter. Cf. the following name.
- **561.** *]βανοβανδαγο* m.: **B** BD2, **zb**7*. **P** [...]ban-bandag, copyist of a Buddhist manuscript. **D** "Slave of ...". Possibly the same as the preceding name.
- **562.** *]βανδαγο* m.: **B** BD2, **zb**1*. **P** [...]-bandag, husband(?) of [...]sag-dukht (**582**), together with whom he seems to have commissioned the copying of a Buddhist manuscript (see SW 2000, 277). **D** "Slave of ...".
- **563.** $J(o\rho)\alpha\gamma o$ m.: **B** Hc167. **P** [...]rag, father of the owner of a seal. **D** Perhaps a compound in - $\beta o\rho \alpha\gamma o$ "son of ...", cf. 410.
- **564.** $J\lambda\mu\alpha\zeta\alpha\delta o$ m.: **B** BD2, **df**2*. **P** [...]lm-azad Bayaspan, sender of a letter. **D** A compound of $\alpha\zeta\alpha\delta o$ "noble" (see s.v. $\alpha\zeta\alpha\delta o\varphi\alpha\rho-\delta\alpha\rho o$, **12**). Possible restorations for the prior component are $[\tau\alpha]\lambda\mu$ (cf. $\tau\alpha\lambda\mu o\zeta\eta\nu o$, **462**) or $[\mu\eta]\lambda\mu$ (cf. $\mu\eta\lambda\mu o\kappa o$, **245**).
- **565.** *Joζ(αδο)* m.: **B** Saeedi no. 4. **P** [...]-zad, owner of a seal. **D** The writing seems to indicate a name containing $\zeta \alpha \delta o$ "born, begotten" (cf. $\mu \iota \iota \rho o \zeta \alpha \delta o$, **250**) rather than $\alpha \zeta \alpha \delta o$ "noble" (for which see s.v. $\alpha \zeta \alpha \delta o \varphi \alpha \rho \delta \alpha \rho o$, **12**).

- **566.** μ *o*]ζδο m. PN(?): **B** BD1, **ae**, verso. **P** [...-mu]zd, witness to a contract? **D** Possibly a compound with * μ *o*ζδο "reward", cf. β *o*δδο- μ *o*ζδο (93), λ αδο μ *o*ζδο (228), or yet another attestation of one of the common names μ *o*ζδο (546) or ω *v* ρ *o* μ *o*ζδο (546).
- **567.** *Joβιδο* m.: **B** BD2, **xd**1. **P** [...]-bid, an Afghan, addressee of a letter. **D** In origin a title, cf. the next.
- **568.** *JBIΔO* m. PN(?): **B** Surkh Kotal, Palamedes inscription, line 1 (CURIEL 1954, 194-197, as corrected by HENNING 1960, 50 n. 9, and 1965, 80 n. 28: *Jβιδο ι ζηνοβιδο ι αβτο[*). **P** Name(?) of an official who bears the titles $\xi \eta v o \beta \iota \delta o$ "chief armourer" and $\alpha \beta \tau o [o \alpha \lambda \gamma o]$ (?). Thus SW–CRIBB 1996, 86, and SW 1998, 86; but it cannot be excluded that this word is yet another title as assumed by HENNING and others. **D** At least in origin a title ending in $-\beta \iota \delta o$ "chief, master" < *-pati-.
- 570. Ιζοοαραζο m.: **B** BD2, **xf**1. **P** [...]z-waraz Shah[...], addressee of a letter. **D** A possible restoration, suggested to me by R. SCHMITT, would be $[\pi\iota\rho\omega]\zetaoo\alpha\rho\alpha\zetao$ "[Piro]z-waraz", cf. 312 above, a name consisting of the same two elements in the opposite order.

It is not clear whether the following $\rho \alpha v[...]$ is a patr./FN or a title, e.g. $\rho \alpha v[\rho \alpha \beta o]$ "satrap".

571. *Joopaζo* m.: **B** BD2, **jd**8. — **P** [...]-wuraz, named in a letter. — **D** Compound containing *oopaζo "boar" (see **356**) as its second component.

- **572.** *Jraio* m.: **B** BD1, **I**4'*. **P** [...]tay Pand[ukan](?) (fl. 483 C.E.), witness to a contract. **D** Unclear. Regarding the possibility of a name-component $\tau \alpha \iota$ see s.v. $\tau \alpha \iota \alpha \gamma o$ (459).
- 573. Juo m.: B BD2, jd1*. P [...]iy Bunakan, addressee of a letter. D Unclear.
- **574.** $J(\rho)$ ο ρ ο κ ο m.: **B** Hc048. **P** [...]rushuk Piroz[an](?), owner of a seal. **D** Presumably a hypocoristic in - κ ο.
- 575. Joko m.: B BD1, aa6. P [...]uk, witness to a contract. D Presumably a hypocoristic in $-\kappa o$.
- 576. *Joβοζανο* m. PN(?): **B** BD2, **xg**2*. **P** [...]-buzan, *khar* of Rob, sender of a letter. **D** Probably a compound name containing * β οζανο as a variant spelling of β ωζανο (108). It is also possible that Jο β οζανο (or just β οζανο) is a patr./FN and that the name of the sender is missing in the preceding lacuna. In that case the underlying PN could be β οζο (94) or a form ending in - β οζο (cf. perhaps τ ωσο β ωζο(?) s.v. τ ωσο, 477).
- **577.** *]μανο* m.: **B** BD1, **ak**24*. **P** [...]man, person or family named in a list. **D** Unclear.
- **578.** *]γγινο* m.: **B** BD2, **jg**1. **P** [...]ngin, a *tarkhan*, addressee of a letter. **D** Unclear.
- **579.** $J\varphi\alpha\rho o$ m.: **B** BD1, **ai**7*. **P** [...]-far, named in a list. **D** Compound containing $\varphi\alpha\rho o < *farnah$ "glory".
- 580.]αγοζιρο m.: **B** Hc149. **P** [...]ag-zir, owner of a seal. **D** Perhaps a compound containing $-\zeta\iota\rho o < \text{Skt. } \acute{sr}\bar{\iota}$ -, cf. $\beta o\delta \delta o \zeta\iota\rho o$ (91).
- **581.** *Jτισο* m.: **B** SW 2005, **Ss**2f. **P** [...]tis (fl. 698 C.E.), son of Berd or Beraw (**81**), from Bokhara, party to a contract. **D** Probably a hypocoristic in -σο.

- **582.** *Jσαγοδοχτο* f.: **B** BD2, **zb**1*. **P** [...]sag-dukht, wife(?) of [...]bandag (**562**), together with whom she seems to have commissioned the copying of a Buddhist manuscript (see SW 2000, 277). **D** A MP compound PN containing *duxt* "daughter" as second component. Differently TREMBLAY 2009, 340, who offers a hypothetical restoration $[o\eta]\sigma\alpha\gamma$ ο-δοχτο together with an extremely adventurous etymology.
- 583. Joonpo m.: B BD1, aa6*. P [...]-wesh, witness to a contract. D Compound containing the DN οηρο "Wesh", see 330.
